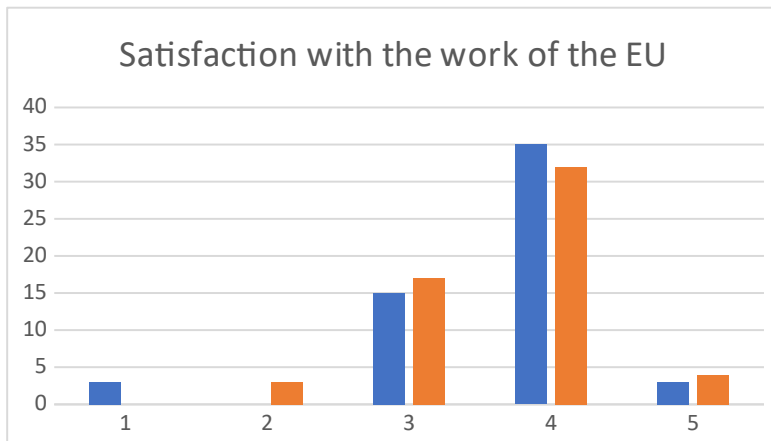


## Report questionnaires – “Camelot” Event

An overall positive trend is highlighted in the graphs \*, on all aspects addressed in the questionnaire there was an improvement between the results collected with the first survey (in the graph, blue columns) and those that emerged after the conference (in the graph, orange columns).

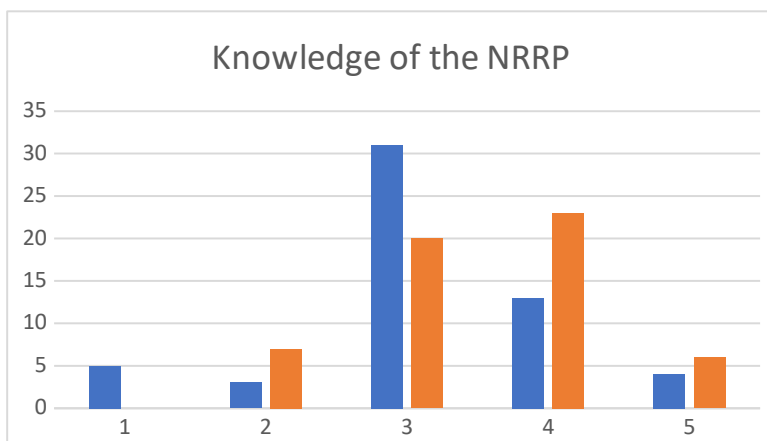

### 1. How satisfied are you, as a citizen, with the work of the European Union?



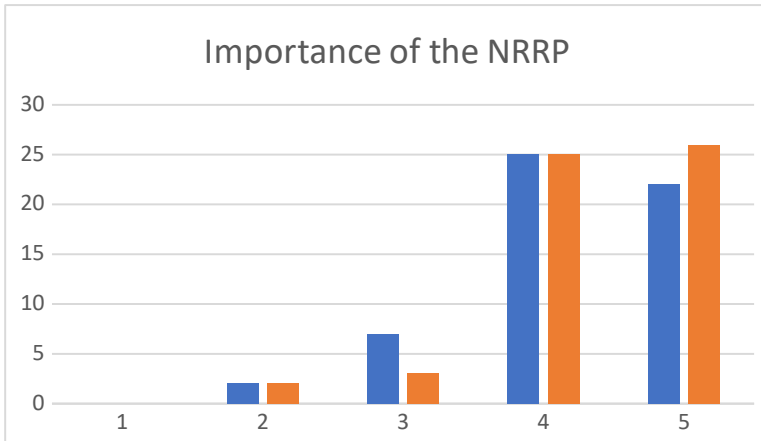
In particular, we can see how the participants' knowledge of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (NRRP) of their respective countries has increased significantly after taking part in the event.

### 2. How well do you know the National Recovery and Resilience Plan presented by your country?



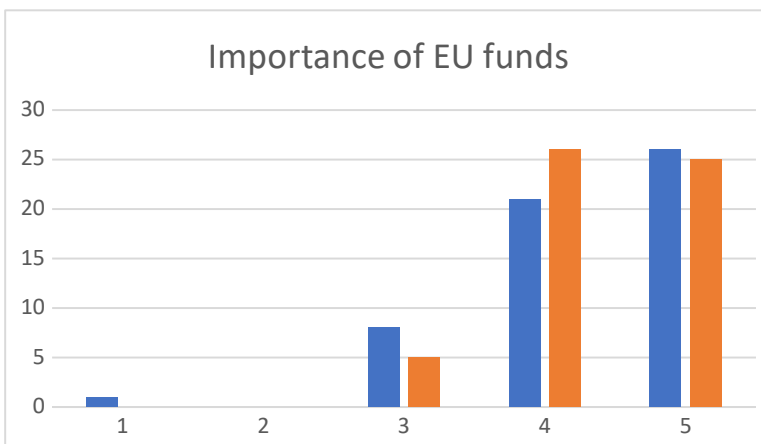
There is also a slight increase in the importance, perceived by citizens, of the PNRR in the recovery process following the crisis linked to the Covid-19 pandemic. It is important to highlight how the participants already perceived its relevance even before taking part in the debate.

### 3. How important do you think the National Recovery and Resilience Plan will be to overcome the current pandemic and economic crisis?



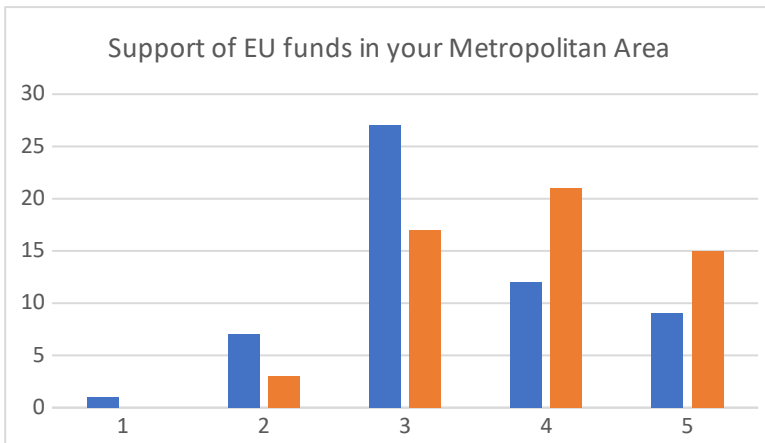
There is also an increase in the perception of the importance of European funds and programs to support the development of Metropolitan Areas and, more generally, in the lives of citizens.

*4. In your opinion, how important are European Funds for the life of citizens?*



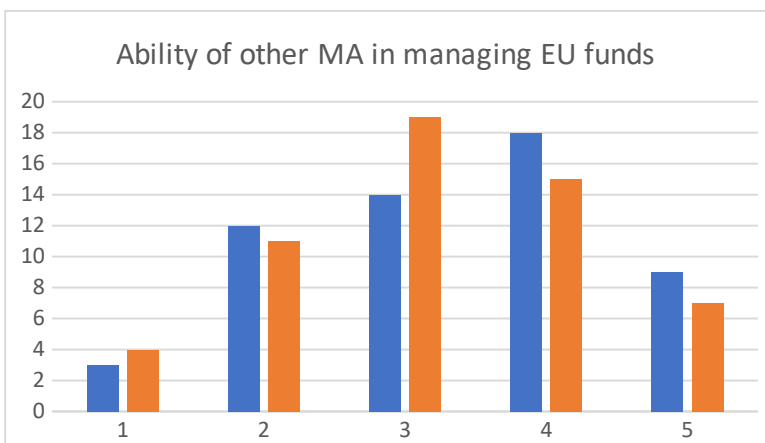
One of the best results in terms of improving the knowledge of the participants is found in relation to the knowledge of the effective impact that European funds have on the Metropolitan Areas in which they live. This point is particularly important, as it is one of the primary objectives of the project, namely to increase knowledge of the work and opportunities related to the European Union and in particular of the use of European funds in the Camelot network.

*5. How strong is the support of European Funds in your Metropolitan City/Area?*



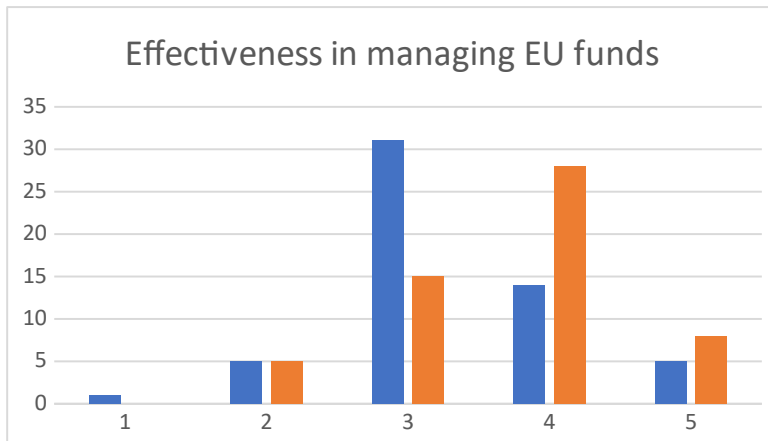
In the next graph, however, it is important to highlight how the analysis of the graph must be done in a decreasing sense. We find ourselves comparing the management capacity of EU funds that our Metropolitan Area has compared to the others. We therefore see a downward trend, which means that participants believe their Metropolitan Area is managing funds better than the European average.

6. *Do you think other Metropolitan Cities/Areas manage European Funds better?*



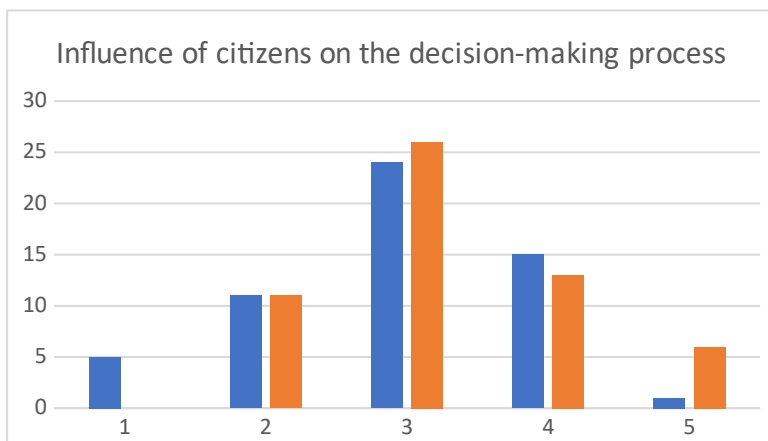
Compared to the effectiveness in the management of funds, we can see the greatest positive increase. This allows us to deduce that the event had a positive impact on the knowledge of the participants; who, following the presentation of the project and more generally of the various European programs, understood the effort made by the administration to ensure a correct and efficient use of the resources.

7. *How effective do you think your Metropolitan City/Area is in managing European Funds?*



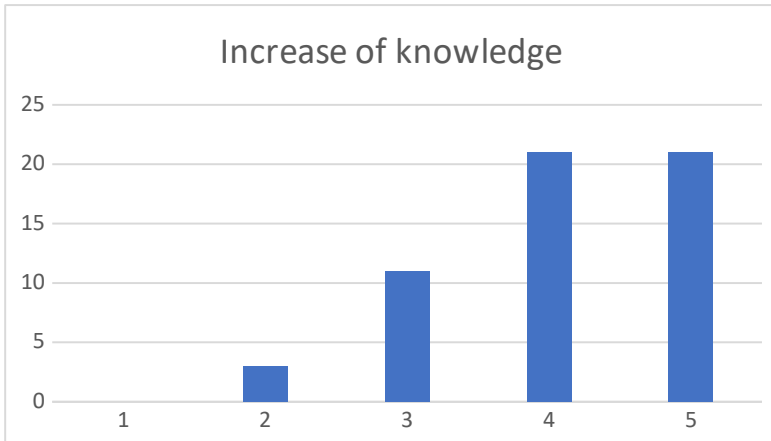
Lastly, we can see how the perception of the influence of citizens on the decisions of policy makers remains substantially unchanged. It will be important to reflect on this aspect, we could start from this feedback to think about including tables for discussion between metropolitan authorities, stakeholders and citizens within the next European projects.

*8. How much do you think the will of citizens influences the decision-making process of local authorities?*

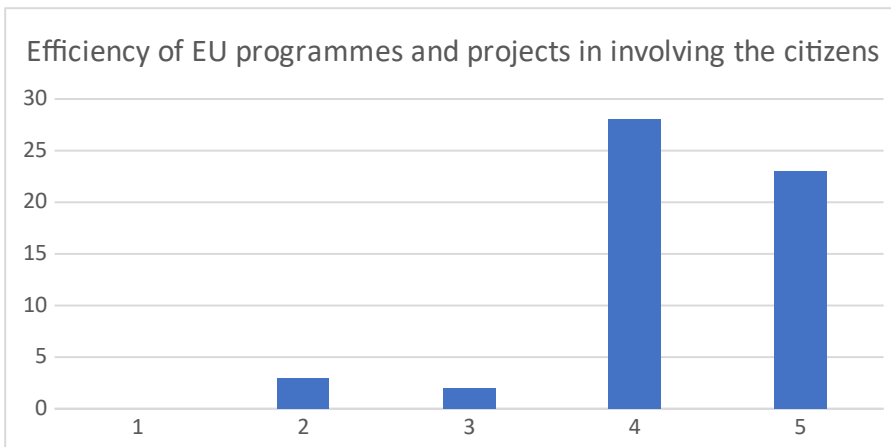


As regards the last two questions, present only in the second survey, an extremely positive evaluation of the event can be highlighted. In particular, about  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the participants confirmed that their knowledge of the topics covered increased considerably thanks to the proposed conferences. At the same time, the survey shows that almost all the citizens involved believe that European programs and projects, such as Europe for Citizens and Camelot, are an effective tool for bringing citizens closer to the European Union.

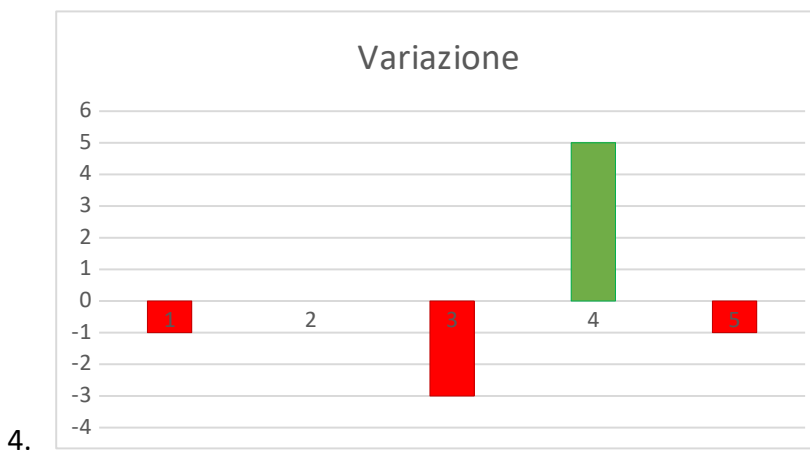
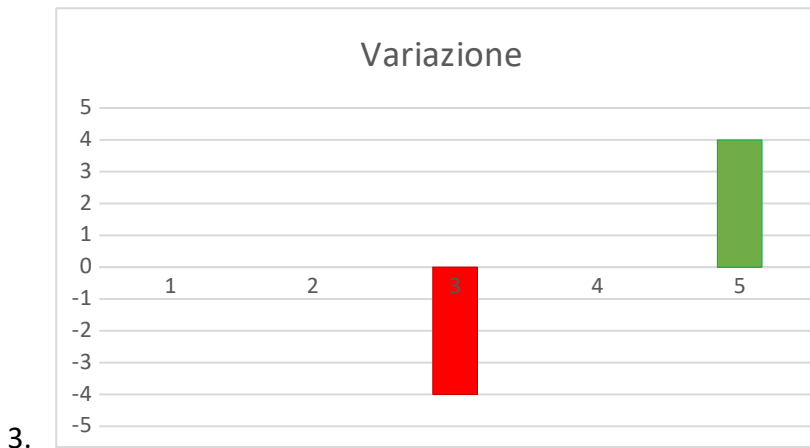
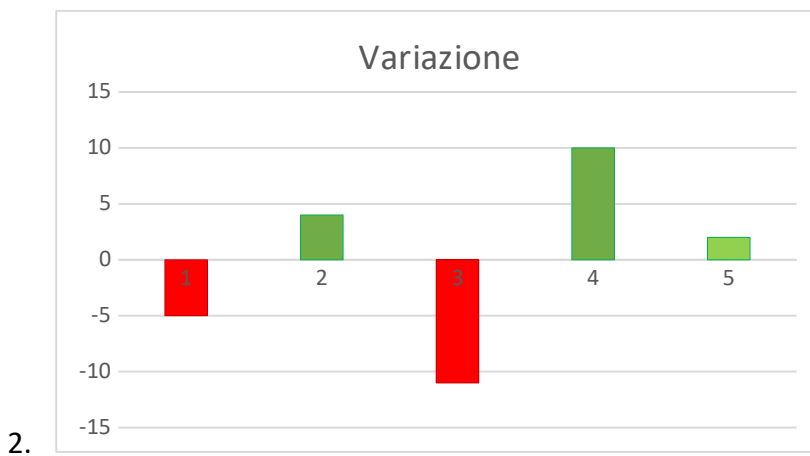
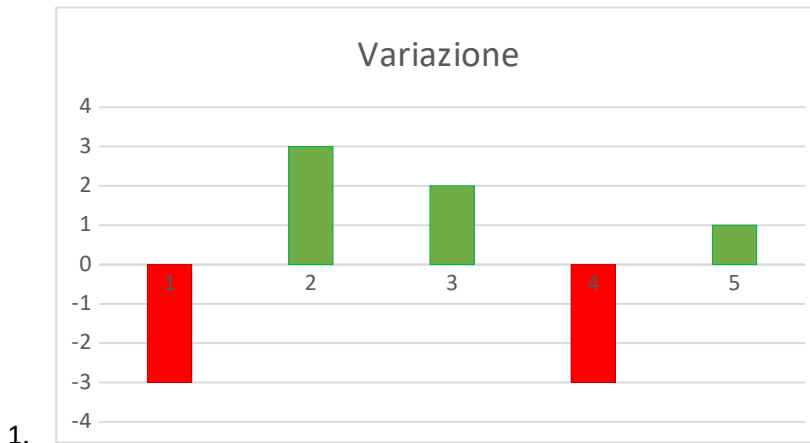
*9. Having followed the conference, do you think that your knowledge of the covered topics has increased?*



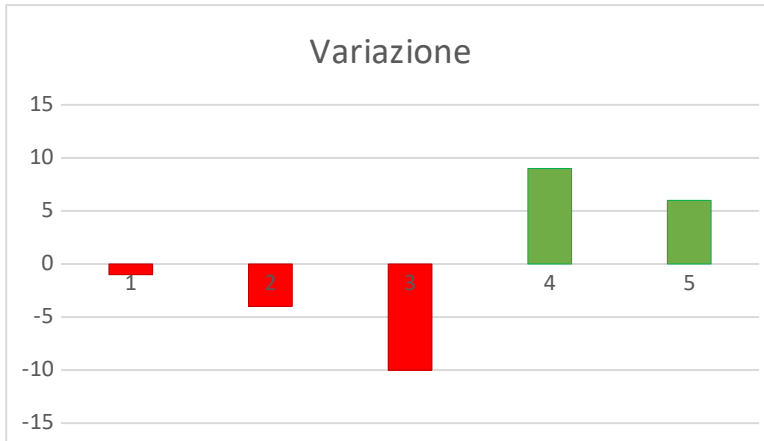
10. Do you believe that projects such as Camelot and Programmes such as Europe for Citizens are an effective way to involve citizens and bring them closer to the European Union?



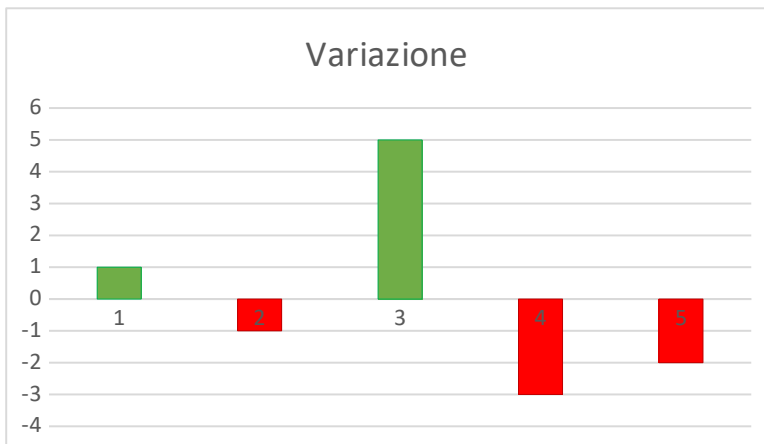

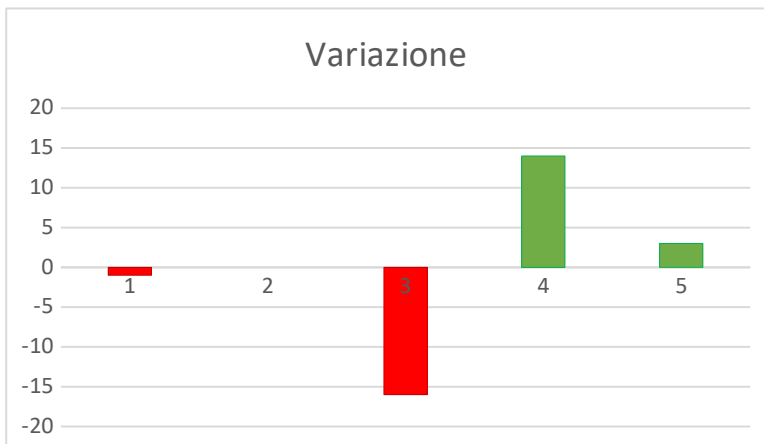
